allcitiesarebeautiful.com is a community-driven, cross-disciplinary platform for contemporary documentary photography and literature, exploring the questions of how human beings are transforming the environment, whether through industrialization, suburbanization, or commercialization. It provides an extensive catalog of artists, authors, and international publishers, as well as various resources for photographic research, inspiration, and progression.

The platform presents and introduces mostly up-and-coming but also well-established photographers who are interested in the subject matter of cities, the built environment and its human dimensions; who favor a straightforward style of photography that emphasizes the form, function, and context of the subjects they photograph—focusing on the structures, signs, and symbols that define the (urban) landscape.

allcitiesarebeautiful.com invites photographers to share insights into their process and practice in the form of an interview and offers relevant news and background information on various artist-centric topics—completely free of charge—thus enabling photographers to share news about their projects and their where- and whatabouts. It propagates a holistic and dialectical methodology as its universal leitmotif and positions itself as a mediator by combining a theoretical and practical approach to the subject matter of cities, urbanization, and the built environment, in close conjunction with contemporary standards and practices.

allcitiesarebeautiful.com founder, Alexandre Kurek, is a freelancing photographer, editor, and curator based in Berlin, who is currently studying European Media Studies at the Faculty of Arts & Media, University of Potsdam, with an emphasis on Artistic Research. He actively seeks out opportunities to introduce, assist, and encourage up-and-coming talents through the platform, its Newsletter, and any accompanying channels—regardless of age, gender, and ethnicity.

Since its founding in 2018, allcitiesarebeautiful.com has been facilitating dialogue, discourse, and participation, for example, through weekly round-ups on Instagram, in which 10 individual artists have their image featured in a carousel post. allcitiesarebeautiful.com promotes respectful interactions and appreciative language, and aims towards diversity in the representation of artists and individual places alike.

Born in the Democratic Republic of Congo and raised in Germany, Alexandre quickly developed a vast interested in different places, primarily cities, already at a young age.

Driven by Fernweh (a longing for distant places), and an eagerness to explore cities and to document and reflect his findings through photography and writings, as well as his career as a freelancing photographer, led him to travel to, and experience a variety of cities in European and North African countries, as well as in Japan and in the United States.

Alexandre now lives and works as a freelancing photographer, editor and curator in Berlin and is currently studying European Media Science with an emphasis on Artistic Research at the Faculty of Arts and Media, University of Potsdam & University of Applied Sciences Potsdam.

His deep interested in the subject matter of cities culminated in the creation of the platform allcitiesarebeautiful.com in 2018.
